
Funding: Shannon Municipal District Community Grant Scheme - Closing Date 21st February 2020

Funding: Social Innovation Fund Ireland: Ability to Work Fund Closing date February 14th 2020

The Ability to Work Fund' is a €1.5 million fund created by Social Innovation Fund Ireland (SIFI) in partnership with State Street and the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection via the Dormant Accounts Fund.

The Ability to Work Fund will support not-for-profit organisations to empower more people with disabilities to gain employment. A disability might be a physical or intellectual disability, a learning disability, or a disability due to traumatic brain injury or a mental health condition.
