TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES



Clare PPN online training seminars

We are excited to announce a season of training seminars, covering such topics as media for community activists, diversity and anti-racism, the workings of local government and county plans. To reserve a place on any of these training sessions, please email admin@clareppn.ie with the session number of the training you wish to attend.

Session 1 is aimed at new PPN Representatives and Secretariat Members and anyone considering standing for election to one of these positions. All the other sessions are open to all-comers!

Please note also that for PPN Representatives who have not previously completed their induction training, attendance at sessions 1 - 4 is required.

• Wednesday, September 9th, 7pm, via Zoom
Session 1 - Welcome to the PPN: Induction for new PPN Representatives and Secretariat Members.

This session will cover your role, responsibilities, travel and subsistence policy, representatives charter, how the PPN works and how to feedback to member groups from your committee or board. Please note that while this session is intended for recently elected representatives, if you are considering standing for a position you are more than welcome to attend.

• Wednesday, September 16th, 7pm, via Zoom
Session 2 - Diversity and anti-racism training: With Vicky Donnelly of Galway One
World Centre, for PPN Representatives and any interested member groups.
This introductory session will cover understanding the roots and origins of racism,

understanding the effects of 'institutional' racism and discrimination in Ireland and how to work for inclusion and diversity in your role as a community representative.

• Wednesday September 23d, 7pm, via Zoom

Session 3 - An Introduction to Local Government in Ireland: With Dr Matt Cannon, for representatives and any interested member groups.

This session will cover the duties and responsibilities of local government in Ireland since the Local Government Act 2014 and the methods through which community groups can have their voices heard in policy-making at local level.

Session 4 - Understanding Clare's County Development Plan and LECP: For PPN Representatives and any interested members.

This session will cover the purpose and function of the County Development Plan and the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) in Clare; how PPN groups can make submissions to both plans; and how the PPN and our representatives are involved in overseeing the LECP.

Session 5 - Media for Community Activists Part 1, with Andrew Hamilton: For PPN representatives and any interested members.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES



National Integration Fund 2020

Grants are available under the National Integration Fund 2020 to projects that combat racism and xenophobia and increase understanding between local communities and immigrants. €749,600 a year over three years will be available to projects that help immigrants improve their language skills, introduce immigrants to the political system or promote integration in schools, the youth sector; workplace, sport, volunteering and cultural activities. Consultation & Participation Network for people with a disability

The new Disability Participation and Consultation Network will enable people with a disability to be involved in the development of policy and legislation. Funding is available for an organisation representing people with disabilities to administer the network as an Organising Member. Latest guidelines on Covid-19

People in Clare and across Ireland have made a huge contribution to reducing the spread of the Covid-19 virus and have helped to save many lives. With cases on the rise again and with schools reopening, it is more important than ever to follow public health advice.

By law, you must now wear a face mask on public transport, in shops and some other indoor settings. See the full list of places:

Masks are also recommended when visiting the homes of those over 70 or who are medically vulnerable, or when sharing a vehicle with someone you don't live with. If you have any symptoms of Covid-19, you should self-isolate and phone your GP straight away - this phone consultation is free of charge. Think Ability programme for young people with disabilities

The Irish Wheelchair Association has launched Think Ability, a Pobal-funded programme, free for participants. Think Ability is for those aged 18-29 with all types of physical disabilities (not just wheelchair users), including hidden disabilities such as epilepsy, dyspraxia and MS. The aim is to support young people to move closer to employment, with career planning, educational options, preparing CVs, mock interviews and more. Coaching can be face-to-face or remote.
