CLARE Many of our member groups are heavily involved in supporting those arriving in Clare from Ukraine. As with the Covid crisis, communities across Clare have responded without hesitancy

and in solidarity to support those fleeing conflict. To date more than 2,000 people, mostly women and children, have arrived in Clare to be accommodated in hotels, halls and other such facilities. Groups are being accommodated in Lisdoonvarna, Ennis, Shannon, Ballyvaughan, Kilkee, Flagmount, Killaloe and Cratloe. Clare based organisations and community groups including Lisdoonvarna Failte, LINKs, Clare Local Development Company, Ballyvaughan Community Development Association, Clare

Immigrant Support Centre, Limerick and Clare Education and Training Board, Love Shannon, Shannon Family Resource Centre, West Clare Family Resource Centre, North-West Clare Family Resource Centre and Mid-West Simon have all been working hard to respond to the immediate needs of those who have come here from Ukraine. Clare PPN is liaising with these organisations and community groups in regular co-ordination meetings to help determine what supports are needed and how they need to be delivered. Clare PPN with Clare Volunteer Centre have supported volunteers with a streamlined volunteer registration and vetting process, securing insurance to cover volunteer efforts and organising

information sessions on trauma, PTSD and self-care for volunteers. So far, these sessions have taken place in Lisdoonvarna, Kilkee and Ballyvaughan with more to follow. As you would expect, many groups and organisations have rallied around this effort, however we have joined the calls for proper resources to be put in place so that these efforts can continue and that our organisations and groups can continue to deliver on their own work and objectives too. Clare is a welcoming place and our community groups are going above and beyond to help and welcome those displaced by war. Clare PPN sends you all our thanks and admiration.

SHANNON GREENWAY Deadline 3rd June: Waterways Ireland, together with Clare and Limerick County Councils are working to develop a Limerick to Scariff Greenway, via Clonlara, Obriensbridge, Killaloe, Ogonolloe and Tuamgraney. Route Options have been developed and community feedback is now sought. A Public Consultation will take place from 25th April to 3rd June. Information will be provided online and there are a

series of open information events scheduled. Feedback can be given at the meetings, and in writing by post or online. The sessions will run from 5-8pm on the following dates:
