Clare Immigrant Support Centre (CISC) has been active in the Banner County since 2007, when it took over from the Irish Refugee Council, which had been working in the county

since 1994. The small but dedicated team at CISC aim to make sure everyone in Clare's immigrant community has access to services and that all their rights and entitlements are upheld. They work hard to support immigrants integrating into their local communities by responding to their individual needs and also by engaging with local service providers, agencies and groups. CISC organises or supports events that offer integration, fun, friendship and creativity. CISC is a part-time service with an office in Ennis, which provides a range of services to all immigrants living and working in Clare, including International Protection applicants,

information, advocacy, training, event and media organising. CISC works together with immigrants, groups and agencies so that immigrant issues are addressed and individuals can have good outcomes in their everyday lives. 




