Sarah Ferrigan gave an overview of finances. €10,000 increase in annual funding for all PPNs is being maintained. Waiting to hear about another possible increase in December. Not sure how much yet. Biggest overspend has been on heat & light. Clare PPN currently has a deficit of approx €183. In 2024, we have the means to pay staff, but without another similar increase, we have no programme budget.

Agreed to write again to Department and to Clare Co Council to say we need an increase in core funding.

• LECP

Enshrining a Just Transition and socio-economic rights in the LECP. It was a great deal of work; a lot of fighting to prevent content being removed. A learning experience for Clare PPN. LECP is going out to public consultation now. We can ask member groups to participate in the public consultation and, if they agree with the elements we had included, show your support for that. That request will be made at launch next Monday.
