LECP PROJECT

Clare PPN and Reps and member groups took part in consultation and drafting of upcoming Local Economic & Community Plan 2024-2030. Due to be launched shortly. PPN was happy with the Framework Document and that our input is included in the plan, but less impressed with the scope and reach of the Implementation Plan.

PPN ELECTIONS

LCDC: 4 nominations received for Community & Voluntary Rep seat on LCDC. Election in progress until 1st April.

JOINT POLICING COMMITTEE

Kieran Burke will be the new community Rep on the Joint Policing Committee, replacing Madeline McAleer, once he is ratified by Clare County Council. Heartfelt appreciation expressed to Madeline for her years of volunteering in this position.

CLARE PPN FUNDING SHORTFALL

Clare PPN will not have enough funds to operate in 2025. Dept has indicated we are not a funding priority. Because Clare PPN is a CLG with its own premises our running costs are higher than many other PPNs. The direct government funding to operate the PPN has not increased sufficiently to cover our overheads for 2024 and this has been temporarily remedied by cutting staff hours. However this will not suffice for 2025 and we are not aware of any current plan to increase the funding from Government. This means we need to come up with a plan by end of third quarter 2024 or else wind up Clare PPN CLG. We have a plan to lobby the Department, while simultaneously seeking new funding sources and projects for 2025. This might necessitate a change in the remit of the CLG. We will come back to members for input when we have a proposal in this regard.

Views expressed that losing PPN would be a huge blow. Also that the PPN's annual funding of €120,000 should be kept in the community.

Barry O'Loughlin, Biodiversity Officer with Clare County Council, gave a presentation on the Clare County Biodiversity Action Plan 2024-2030.
